**Divisions:** Open (O), any rider who does not correctly designate themselves as a Junior, Young Rider or Adult Amateur will automatically be placed in the Open Division. Junior (J), classes open to riders through the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Young Rider (Y), classes are open to riders from the beginning of the calendar year they turn 16 years of age through the end of the calendar year they turn age 21. Adult Amateur (A), classes are open to non professional riders over the age of 21 who would be eligible for the USEF Amateur card.

EVEN THOUGH THIS IS A SCHOOLING SHOW, EVERY EFFORT WILL BE MADE TO RUN IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK. The USEF rulebook is available free of charge on line at [www.USEF.org](http://www.USEF.org).

**Entry Procedures: Please use the Utah Dressage Society Short Tour Series entry blank!** Even though this is a UDS schooling show, every effort will be made to follow USEF rules and USDF guidelines, which are in effect from the time horses arrive on the show grounds on the show day. Entries will be accepted on a first come basis based on the postmark. No entries postmarked prior to the opening date will be accepted unless the show does not fill. No entries will be accepted without payment in full included. Checks should be made payable to Millbrook Farms. **Mail completed entry form to Jan Lawrence, PO Box 237, Cedar Fort, UT 84013.** Freestyle entries must be accompanied by a photocopy of a test verifying eligibility to enter the class (60% score at highest test of level) with the exception of FEI YR and Junior freestyles. All entry forms must have original signatures (rider, owner/agent, trainer, and coach if applicable). A parent or guardian must sign for any Junior under the age of 18. A current Coggins test is required for horses coming from outside the state of Utah. You must include verification of current vaccination per USEF rule GR845. Management reserves the right to limit the number of horses entered by an owner and/or the number of horses ridden by a rider. This show is limited to 60 rides total. A returned check will void the

entry and incur a \$50 charge. Any entry postmarked after the Closing Date of June 2, 2017 will incur a \$20 post entry fee. Any changes to an entry must be written or emailed to the Jan Lawrence ([millbrk@xmission.com](mailto:millbrk@xmission.com)) by June 2, 2017. Each change will cost \$10. Change of horse or rider will cost \$25 and will constitute a new entry. Management reserves the right to refuse any entry. You must have permission from the Show Secretary before bringing any non-showing horses on the grounds during the competition.

**Saddlery and Braiding:** We encourage competitors to follow the rules with regard to saddlery, tack and dress. Whenever you are mounted, you must be wearing an ASTM approved helmet with secured chin strap and boots with a heel – no exceptions! Braiding is optional.

**Vaccination Notice:** Exhibitors are reminded of USEF's new vaccination policy, effective 12/1/15; see GR845 for details. You can obtain the form from USEF at <https://www.usef.org/documents/membership/EquineVaccinationRecord.pdf>. The completed form, signed by your veterinarian, can be included with your entry. If you select an alternative option under the rules, please bring required documentation. In accordance with the rule, competition management has the right to review vaccination documentation for every entry. Non-compliant entries may be quarantined or denied permission to unload, and will not be allowed to compete nor to mingle with other horses. **No refunds will be given if right to compete is denied because the vaccination documentation is missing or incomplete.** Even though this is a show unrecognized by USEF, all competitors need to be aware of this policy and should follow this procedure.

**No Shows:** We reserve the right to fill all of a competitor's subsequent ride times if a competitor fails to notify the competition of his/her intention to scratch.

**Refunds:** Refunds less the office fee will be given from the opening date to the closing date. No refunds of any kind for any reason including Acts of God will be given after the closing date and throughout the competition unless rides are filled from the waitlist. The waitlist will be maintained through June 6th. Stabling will be refunded if the horse is scratched on or before June 3rd or if the stall can be given to another competitor during the show.

**Awards:** Ribbons for First through Sixth place. Tests and ribbons can be picked up at the show office. A high score award will be given for the highest scoring rider in each level Training – Second regardless of Junior, Adult Amateur or Open status. Classes 133, 134, 135 and 136 will be pinned as one class regardless of division or level.

**Fees:** Class fees for all classes are \$25 per class. Office fee of \$10 per entry. Grounds fee if not stabled on site \$10. Stabling cost is \$25 for Friday through Saturday, with bedding provided (see below for further information regarding stabling). You do not pay both grounds fee and stabling, just one or the other. If you have questions about how to fill out your entry blank, please call Jan Lawrence at (801)631-2516 for assistance.

**Times and Acknowledgement:** The preferred method of notification for all entries is email, so please include a clearly readable email address with entry. Official times will be posted at noon the day before the show at the Show Office. Unofficial times will be available at [www.millbrookfarms.com](http://www.millbrookfarms.com) by June 7, 2017 or you may call the Show Secretary Jan Lawrence at (801)631-2516.

**Stabling:** Stabling is first-come, first-served with a complete paid entry. Stalls are all permanent, of substantial construction, at least 12' x 12', with solid sides and doors, and are both indoors and newly added under cover outside. Outside paddocks with gates are available that may or may not have shelters. Bedding for all stalls will be provided and is included in the cost. Tack stalls may be available, check with show management. No nails or staples are allowed to be affixed to any stalls. Zip ties are allowed. Hanging organizers are allowed as long as they are not nailed or stapled to the stall itself. All horse riders/owners must provide emergency contact information for horses stabled on site. We will make every effort to accommodate requests for stabling. Contact the Show Secretary Jan Lawrence via phone or email to discuss availability and any special needs.

**Arenas:** Two permanent 20m x 60m outdoor arenas with permanent judges' booths. One outdoor 70m x 70m warm up area and one 30m x 70m indoor arena warm up area. All arenas have excellent sand footing. For lunging area, inquire at show office or warm up ring stewards. No lunging in the warm up areas including the indoor arena. Grooms, trainers, coaches and friends must stay outside of the warm up arenas. Spectator areas are clearly marked and we ask that friends and family accompanying riders be informed to use those areas. **Riders and horses always have the right of way during competitions.** Schooling during off times and hand walking during the competition must be pre-arranged with show management.

**Hospitality:** Food will also be available on site during the show. Camping on site in self contained units is allowed. We have limited RV hookups for \$25/night.

**Directions:** We are about a mile east of SR-73 in Fairfield. The barn address is 17471 W 1300 N, Fairfield, UT 84013. Directions are available at [www.millbrookfarms.com](http://www.millbrookfarms.com) under the directions tab. **Please do not rely on Google maps or other GPS directions at this time.**

**Miscellaneous:** This is a private facility. No dogs are allowed on the grounds. Emergency numbers for vet and farrier on call are posted in the show office and near all show stabling areas. Freestyle music must be on an MP3 player or iPod/iPad/iPhone and must be presented to the show announcer. A sound check will be scheduled at the convenience of show management and competitors. Sharps containers are available and their locations will be provided at check in. **There is no smoking allowed anywhere on the grounds.**

Because this show is UDS Short Tour Recognized only scores earned do not count towards qualifying for Regional Championships, USDF medals or musical freestyle bars, nor do scores count towards UDS year end awards. If your goals include qualifying for the regional championships, earning scores towards USDF medals or participating in UDS year end awards, please return for our recognized competitions on July 8-9 and August 12-13.

# ASSUMPTION OF RISK, WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY

I [PRINT NAME HERE] \_\_\_\_\_ (hereafter, "Participant", which term includes Participant's parent or legally-appointed Guardian, if a minor), freely and voluntarily seek to participate in any or all programs, events and/or activities sanctioned, produced, or sponsored by the Utah Dressage Society ("UDS") that include educational and training programs, youth programs, clinics, and/or competitions at any time and at any location. These activities, programs, and events will hereafter be referred to as "the Activities," and the UDS, together with its sponsors, managers, property owners, officials, organizers and affiliates and their respective directors, officers, members, employees, agents, volunteers, representatives, and designated officials will collectively be referred to as "Event Sponsor."

In consideration of the Event Sponsor allowing Participant to participate in the Activities, now and in the future, Participant agrees as follows:

## 1. Acknowledgment of Inherent Risks of Equine Activities/Assumption of Risks.

Participant acknowledges that there are numerous inherent risks of equine activities, whether preparing for, entering, attending, participating in, or leaving the Event. The inherent risks include those dangers and conditions which are an integral part of equine activities, including, but not limited to: (a) the propensity of an equine or other animal to behave in ways that may result in injury, harm, or death to persons on or around them; (b) the unpredictability of the equine's reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movements and unfamiliar objects, persons or other animals; (c) certain hazards such as surface or subsurface conditions; (d) collisions with other animals or objects; (e) the potential of a participant or other Participant to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to the participant, Participant, or others, such as failing to maintain control over the equine or not acting within his or her ability; (f) the breakage or failure of tack or other equipment; and (g) the potential that an equine or animal may cause injury or harm to the rider or other persons or animals in the vicinity. Participant is not relying on Event Sponsor to list within this document all possible inherent risks or all risks of participating in any of the Activities at any location.

## 2. Waiver and Release of Liability.

With full knowledge and appreciation of these and other inherent risks associated with equine activities and the Activities, Participant freely and voluntarily assumes the risks of the equine activities involved in any aspect of them. In this connection, Participant also voluntarily agrees to waive any and all rights to sue and hereby releases the Event Sponsor from all liability, loss, claims, or actions for injury, death, expenses, or damage to person or property resulting from the inherent risks of the Event, or resulting from any action or inaction by the Event Sponsor. This waiver and release is effective even if the injury, death or damage to person or property is caused by, or contributed to by, actions or failure to act of the Event Sponsor and which actions or inactions constitute ordinary negligence or a violation of any applicable law pertaining to equine activity liabilities. Neither Participant nor Participant's representatives shall make any claim against, maintain an action against, or recover from the Event Sponsor or its sponsors, directors, officers, members, employees, agents, volunteers, representatives, designated officials, or others acting on their behalf for injury, loss, damage or death of the Participant, to the Participant's horse, or to the Participant's personal property (regardless of ordinary negligence by the Event Sponsor or regardless of an alleged violation of an applicable equine activity liability law).

## 3. Utah's Equine Activity Liability Act.

Pursuant to the Utah Equine Activity Liability Act, § 78-27b-101, et seq., it shall be presumed that participants in equine or livestock activities are aware of and understand that there are inherent risks associated with these activities. An equine activity sponsor, equine professional, livestock activity sponsor, or livestock professional is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant due to the inherent risks associated with these activities. "Inherent risk" with regard to equine or livestock activities means those dangers or conditions which are an integral part of equine or livestock activities, which may include: (a) The propensity of the animal to behave in ways that may result in injury, harm, or death to persons on or around them; (b) the unpredictability of the animal's reaction to outside stimulation such as sounds, sudden movement, and unfamiliar objects, persons, or other animals; (c) collisions with other animals or objects; (d) the potential of a participant to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to the participant or others, such as failing to maintain control over the animal or not acting within his or her ability.

## 4. Miscellaneous.

This document is intended to be as broad and inclusive as applicable state law permits. If any clause conflicts with applicable law, only that clause will be void but the remainder shall stay in full force and effect.
